Unnoticed No More

For so many kūpuna a knock on the door is powerful. It might not seem like a big deal to many of us. But, to a homebound kupuna, it could signal the arrival of the only person they might see all day or all week long. A knock on the door may save a life.

Last year, we received a call from a concerned neighbor. He spoke quickly with worry and desperation. It had been a month since "Uncle George" had running water, he shared. He had been delivering groceries and bottled water whenever he could, but George's health was declining. His situation had become a crisis.

Our staff – a meal delivery driver and social worker - arrived the same day with emergency meals and a case of water. It was over the course of many deliveries that week that we got to know George and became better acquainted with his needs.

At 77, George was a retired boat captain and bachelor. Estranged from his siblings, he lived alone in his home, which was heaped with old newspapers, containers full of odds and ends, and broken furniture. The floor was barely visible. It became clear that George was also struggling with memory loss.

Every weekday our meal delivery staff and volunteers brought him a hot meal and water. We purchased



a phone for him, so we could keep in touch and in hopes that he could make the calls necessary to restore his water and electricity. **But we soon realized** that George needed much more than just meals. He needed extensive care coordination.

We spent the five months working with supportive agencies, including Medicaid and Adult Protective Services (APS), to help George access the high level of care he needed, such as those available through Adult Foster Care. We sat with him during every phone call, helping him navigate the complex maze of healthcare and social security benefits and discussing his medical needs with his physician.

"Right when we thought it couldn't get worse, we'd learn of something else," his neighbor shared. "Hawai'i Meals on Wheels saved Uncle George's life. I can sleep better at night knowing that he's safe."

Now more than ever, we are seeing a growing number requests for kūpuna with multiple, severe chronic health and mental wellness problems and emergency living situations. The number of kūpuna with emergency needs like George's is far greater than we ever imagined.

So many have fallen through the gaps. They weren't on anyone's radar. They downplayed their concerns. They didn't know who to turn to for help. Once they become known to us, no matter how complex their situation, Hawai'i Meals on Wheels will help them age with dignity without fear of hunger.

The kindness of friends like you keep us on the road delivering meals and talking story with kūpuna. George's experience would have been impossible without the support of people like you!

When I reflect on how seamlessly the Hawai'i Meals on Wheels staff worked together to address seemingly insurmountable challenges to help George, I am filled with pride and gratitude for their hardwork and compassion.

They not only work efficiently to serve hundreds of clients every month, they are skilled in identifying needs and training volunteers to do the same, while working with community partners to provide solutions.

Thanks to your support, this past year, we continued to respond to the surge in meal requests. Only because of your generosity were we able to fully sponsor meals for 250 kūpuna residents when emergency funding for meals to affordable senior communities ended abruptly this summer. In addition, we formed a congregate dining partnership with the YMCA of Honolulu to serve kūpuna members at five of their locations islandwide.

This year, I'm excited to announce that we have expanded for the first time to serve those on the

Waianae Coast. In 2023, let's continue to do more for those who truly have


Q&A with Delivery Driver Mike Lundy **Rhythm on the Road**

Meet Mike Lundy. He's Hawai'i Meals on Wheels most veteran staff member; he's been with us for more than 21 years. What many on his routes may not know is he also created some of our island's grooviest music!

Born and raised in Nu'uanu, Mike was composing original music from a young age. In 1979 in Honolulu, he recorded and released a now internationally-acclaimed LP called *The Rhythm Of Life*.



After completing his deliveries, we enjoyed an afternoon chatting with Mike about his music and the past two decades as a meal delivery driver.

What do you find most rewarding about your job?

Caring for our kūpuna, it just feels good inside. I love my job. I've said this for years, it isn't like a job. My most memorable times are deliveries during the holidays when our clients are feeling loneliest. They'll say, "You're bringing us meals and on top of that gifts!?" It really moves me.

What has changed in the past 20 years? When I started, I was one of only two drivers covering about four routes. Today, we have 6 drivers covering more than 70 routes with the help with 100 volunteers! The need for home-delivered meals has grown exponentially. It's all flown by so fast. I'm now serving some kūpuna who are younger than me!

Where does music and serving kūpuna intersect?

Delivering meals and performing aren't that much different at all. When you're performing you want to make people happy and take them into a better place. The same with meals. You go to their homes, give them joy and nourishment, and help them get away from their situation for a while.

Mike's inventive rhythms have experienced a resurgence in popularity worldwide. Blending jazzy pop and funk, his music can be heard on our local stations, in Brazilian cafes, and have even been remixed and played in London clubs! But the heightened popularity of his music hasn't gone to his head. He continues to serve kūpuna with humility and compassion – bringing his lively funk and soul on the road to share with kūpuna.
